## About the Foundation



This pride of Hong Kong golf is Hong Kong's first professional golfer to play in the circuit.

In 2019, the Foundation and Hong Kong Tennis Association announced the formation of the EFG HKTA Tour Team, nurturing top female tennis players like Eudice Chong 張瑋樞 and Cody Wong 王康怡. Eudice has thus far captured four singles and 26 doubles titles on the ITF Women's Circuit. In 2022, she reached career-highs in both singles and doubles when her WTA rankings peaked at No. 213 and No. 134 respectively.

As one of the leading Swiss banks in the region, established less than 30 years ago, we see synergies between ourselves and promising young athletes. We are only here today because of the many clients who believed in us from day one and gave us the opportunity to serve them. It is in the spirit of excellence that the Foundation began life in 2009.

The Foundation was initially established as the EFG Young Golfers Foundation to support and nurture promising young local golfers of Hong Kong. When Tiffany Chan 陳芷澄 was a 14-year-old amateur, she joined one of the Foundation's elite junior golfing programmes but has since broadened the scope of its support for athlete development beyond golf.

The Foundation has continued to support Tiffany with a scholarship that helped her through her amateur and college careers, as well as her Rio Olympics campaign. She is the first and only Hong Kong golfer to be represented in the Olympics.

Cody has a career-high singles ranking by the WTA of 219, achieved on 26 June 2023, and a career-high WTA doubles ranking of 156, attained on 17 October 2022. She has won three singles and 16 doubles titles on the ITF Women's Circuit.

Since 2018, the Foundation has been offering a unique scholarship programme that helps to develop talented athletes into great ones and aims to play a significant role in producing Hong Kong-born and bred world-class athletes. Beneficiaries of our scholarship programme include Vincent Capol (Hong Kong's top junior equestrian), top Hong Kong junior golfers, Chloe Chan and Arianna Lau, among others.

We are pleased to appoint Matthew Cheung as EFG Young Athletes Foundation Hong Kong Ambassador for 2023. His commitment and dedication towards golf is inspiring and we hope that through Matthew, many other young Hong Kongers will be inspired to pursue their own passions.

## About the EFG-SGA Elite Young Golfers Scholarship
